Reorienting Education: Responding to the Impact of Covid 19

The Mico University College invites academic researchers, educators, policymakers to submit their manuscripts for publishing consideration in the forthcoming issue of the Mico Journal of Education (MUJOE). Volume 9 will be focused on a review of the Covid-19 experience, what we have learnt, and recommendations to strengthen our coping mechanism. We are particularly interested in papers which look at Jamaica's state of readiness for online teaching and learning; the psychological impact on students, teachers and parents; the role of teacher training institutions in training and re-tooling to chart new frontiers.

Presenters at the University College's 2021 Research Day, are particularly encouraged to submit completed papers.

SCOPE

The Mico University College Journal of Education accepts for publication, empirical research and evaluations of promising practices and policies in the field of education. Manuscripts should be concise but of sufficient length to ensure theoretical and/or methodological competence. The journal will also consider literature reviews that support efforts to transform institutions; inspire colleagues; engage campus, governmental, and private-sector leaders; and articulate culturally relevant outcomes.

The Journal is a peer-reviewed publication of the Mico University College. An external peer review committee selects the most suitable papers based on academic merit, and adherence to submission guidelines, and recommends them for publication.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES



AUTHORS IDENTIFICATION

Please ensure your name, telephone number and email address are stated on your cover page. Correspondence is handled by email, so a valid email address is important. **DO NOT** send your cover page as a separate document.

FILE FORMAT: Microsoft Word (.doc) format

Paper Length: **5 to 20 single-spaced manuscript pages.**

Font: Times New Roman, 12 pt

Tables: All tables must be produced using Microsoft Word. **DO NOT COPY** from Excel **OR SPSS OR** any other file format.

Colour: All text graphs, and photographs will be produced in black and white.

FORMATTING: Prepare manuscripts according to the [Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association \(6th Edition\)](#). Manuscripts may be copyedited for bias-free language.

ABSTRACT AND KEYWORDS: All manuscripts must include an abstract containing a maximum of 250 words typed on a separate page. After the abstract, please supply up to five keywords or brief phrases.

REFERENCES: List references in alphabetical order. Each listed reference should be cited in text, and each text citation should be listed in the References section. Examples of basic reference formats:

PERMISSIONS: Authors of accepted papers must obtain and provide to the editor on final acceptance all necessary permissions to reproduce in print and electronic form any copyrighted work, including, for example, test materials (or portions thereof) and photographs of people.

PUBLICATION POLICIES: The same manuscript is prohibited from being submitted for concurrent consideration by two or more publications. Authors are required to reveal any possible conflict of interest in the conduct and reporting of research (e.g. financial interests in a test/product, or data commissioned for the exclusive use of a third party).

SUBMISSION: Submit manuscripts electronically to: iter1@themico.edu.jm by the stated deadline. All papers previously submitted for Research Day 2021, must be resubmitted for consideration.
