TOURS


- Tour 1: Port Royal, Heroes Park, Spanish Town, Tuff Gong Records, Bob Marley Museum
- **Tour 2:** National Gallery of Jamaica; Institute of Jamaica; Mico Indian, African and Caribbean (INAFCA) Museum
- Tour 3: Maroon Weekend: Charles Town Maroons, Overnight stay, includes, museum tour, river bathing, Drumming lessons, herbal workshop, overnight with maroon community bed and breakfast arrangements. (Next day trip to the Moore Town Maroons, site on national Heroine Grandy Nanny. Or Continue up the Buff Bay Pass to Hollywell for a Nature Hike and end with a visit to a Coffee Plantation.)
- Tour 4: St. Thomas: Stony Gut, Morant Bay, Bath, Morant Point Light House OR Dunn's River, Green Grotto Caves and Montego Bay
- Tour 5: South Coast: YS Falls, Black River Safari, Negril Beach





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RATIONALE & PHILOSOPHY

People are always exploring and seeking new experiences. Finding a new place, integrating with the community, interacting with the local people, and understanding the way these people live are exciting advantages of studying abroad.

Jamaica is known across the world because of international singers such as the Hon. Robert Nesta "Bob" Marley and Jimmy Cliff; renowned athletes like the Hon. Usain Bolt, and cricketers like Chris Gayle. The Blue and John Crow Mountains, home to the Jamaican Maroons, with retentions of the Jamaican Taino; the many endemic plant and bird species form part of our rich heritage.



PROGRAMME DESCRIPTION

This programme is designed for international students at the tertiary level who:
